

Campfire Risk Assessment – Hertfordshire Guide Centre

Description: The campfire circle is situated to the left of the Guide Centre. The campfire pit is surrounded by paving slabs and improvised log seating. The wood pile is found to the left of the campfire circle, behind the trellis.

Intended outcomes: Enjoyment, community, performing, and fun.

Leaders are responsible for reviewing and amending the risk assessment with considerations for their unit. It is recommended that this be completed during a site visit and subsequently shared with the leadership Team. The campfire activity should be listed on the Information and Consent Forms.
