

Venue (Outdoor) Risk Assessment - Hertfordshire Guide Centre

Description: Hertfordshire Guide Centre is located in the village of Cottered. It offers indoor accommodation, a campsite, pond, and campfire circle. It is suitable for meetings, trainings, sleepovers, cams, pond dipping sessions and campfires. It can also be used for Duke of Edinburgh expeditions.

Intended outcomes: Enjoyment, community, performing, and fun.

Leaders are responsible for reviewing and amending the risk assessment with considerations for their unit. It is recommended that this be completed during a site visit and subsequently shared with the leadership Team. Individual risk assessments are available for each activity.

Toilet block Slips and falls	All participants	Floor to be mopped regularly to reduce the risk of standing water.	L	L		Leaders
Toilet block Skin irritation from soap products	All participants	 Leaders to be aware of those with known skin conditions. Data sheets for soap products to be kept in the cleaning cupboard. Own products to be provided if allergies/sensitivities are known 	L	L		Leaders and parents
Storage area behind the toilet block • Accidental injury	All participants	Access restricted by wooden fencing.	L	L		Leaders
Camp store • Electrical fire/electrocution	Leaders and site staff.	 All electrical items to be PAT tested regularly. Visiting leaders to report any issues with the electrical equipment. 	L	L		Leaders and site staff
Camp store • Falling items from shelves	All participants	 Heavy items to be stored on lower shelves. Avoid stacking multiple items on top of each other. 	L	L		Leaders and site staff
Camp shelter • Slips, trips and falls	All participants	 Ensure that the entrance is free from obstacles. Ensure that the mat is lying flat at all times. Mop the floor to remove residual water and reduce the risk of slipping. 	L	L		All participants

Big games storage • Accidental injury All participants	 Access restricted with combination lock. Heavy items are labelled and should be carried by two people. Leaders to supervise use of big games. Big games to be returned to storage as per the picture on the door. 		 Leaders to complete their own unit specific risk assessment. Soft archery has it's own risk assessment which should be referred to.
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
