A number of our volunteers have given extraordinary service for many, many years.

Marilyn was one of the volunteers who were recognised and her story made it into the local press.

Here's what was said:

Marilyn Tozer has been a Girlguiding volunteer for half a century. Her dedicated service was celebrated recently with the presentation of a special 50-year Long Service brooch and certificate.

Marilyn previously served as district commissioner and currently mentors new leaders as well as being a division secretary. She has no intention of hanging up her uniform quite yet, and recalls some of her favourite memories over the five decades:

'I started by becoming a leader with the unit where I had been a Brownie. In 1977, I moved to 17th Watford Brownies where I met Carole Robson. She went on to be the leader of 9th Watford Brownies and we took our girls away on unit holidays together for many years. I love this time away with the Brownies, having time to get to know the girls really well and seeing them develop their independence and confidence.'

Due to a lack of leaders, we amalgamated our units in 2018, and I am delighted Carole and I are working together again.

More recently, I was thrilled to visit the Guiding World Centre in Switzerland with some of my closest guiding friends.

I've seen so many changes during the 50 years, including several styles of uniform. The programme has changed with the times, but the fundamental principles have always remained the same, and are the reason why I have never wanted to give up guiding.'

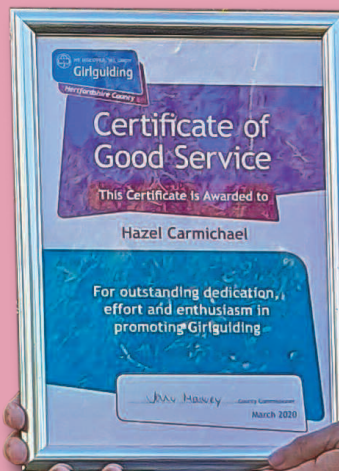
However, life often presents opportunities for a reason - so I took a leap of faith and have since been joined by a wonderful team with a variety of skills.

Meet Jo Bushe

— the new West Hertfordshire Division Commissioner

When I was approached by Jenny, our County Commissioner, about taking on the role of division commissioner I was initially a little hesitant as I didn't really know much about what the role entailed.

However, after a conversation with the outgoing division commissioner, I thought the role sounded really interesting and actually not too different to that of district commissioner, which was the role I held at the time (although with fewer risk assessments to deal with!)

I'm really looking forward to getting to know as many leaders as possible in our division as, up until now, I've really only come into contact with leaders in Berkhamsted. I'm also looking forward to providing support to the leaders and, when things are a little more 'normal', I hope to organise some division wide events for both the girls and leaders. Angela leaves big shoes to fill and I know she, and of course the county team, will be there to answer any questions I may have.

HOW TO SUBMIT PHOTOS FOR SHARE MAGAZINE

We love receiving your photos to include in *Share* Magazine
and it wouldn't be the magazine it is without them.
To ensure we have the best quality photos to include in
Share, here are some helpful steps:

- ▶ When submitting photos, please email them to
share@girlguidinghertfordshire.org.uk in their 'original size'
ideally between 1-3MB if possible. If smaller than 1MB
(e.g. 100kb) the quality of the photo will be compromised
when transferring to *Share* Magazine and may not be able to
be used.
 - ▶ If sending multiple photos, we would suggest emailing them
separately to avoid them being condensed/made smaller.
 - ▶ Most mobile phones try and make photos smaller
when sending by email so they
get sent quicker. If prompted
(see illustration opposite from
iPhone), please tick the box
that highlights 'Actual Size'.
Again, if sending multiple
photos, it may be automatically
condensed without giving an
option to send in its actual size so
best to send photos individually.
 - ▶ If you are a parent sending photos to leaders, please send
these by email rather than WhatsApp. WhatsApp greatly
reduces the size of the photo, usually making it around 40-
70kb in size which is very small.
- If you have any queries in relation to submitting photos,
